**SCHOLASTIC BOOK FAIR**

During this term, we will be starting a new and exciting spelling programme in years 2 – 6 called 'Read Write Inc. Spelling'. It involves daily teaching that will develop secure spelling knowledge. Phonics underpins this programme, it also develops children's knowledge of word families, how suffixes impact upon root words, and provides mnemonics to remember the trickiest spellings. Instead of 'weekly spelling words' with a test set weekly, children will get a set of words per unit to learn (units last up to 2 weeks) that they will practise and challenge each other on using fun and engaging tasks, allowing the children to play with words and help them find ways to commit new words to memory effectively. Any extra support you can provide in helping your child to practise these words is greatly valued.
