Thank you to our Foundation Stage parents who attended our EYFS Phonics workshop on Monday. It was really well attended and we hope that you found the session useful; the way we teach children to read now is so different to how we were taught!

You might have spotted our Year Three children arriving to school in some rather different attire this week... This was for their Stone Age workshop in which the children made many links across the curriculum. The children ground wheat into flour to help them make honey bread, made pendants out of clay as well as jewellery and reed firelighters. It is safe to say that if our Year Three children were around in the Stone Age, they would have done very well for themselves!

We are really enjoying seeing many people attend our running club sessions on a Thursday morning. Everyone is welcome (KS1 must be accompanied by an adult).
