Our elf has had great fun this week!




The Elf had great fun in the kitchen preparing the Christmas cupcakes!

The Elf loved the Year 5 writing this week and learnt a lot about diversity, racial equality and black history.




Look at these amazing hats and teddy that the Elf found – he looks super cosy!

The Year 2 children wrote some amazing promises that the Elf found – I wonder how many promises will be kept over Christmas?..!




The Elf trying to shelter from the rain today underneath the bird table!
