Dear Parents/Carers,

This term, year 4 have been exploring coasts and the problems surrounding plastic pollution. On Monday lunchtime, we collected the rubbish from all the packed lunches and are writing to inform you about the astonishing amount of waste produced each day at Devoran School.

From only 64 lunch boxes, we were shocked



to find **339** items of waste were produced in total. In particular, our surprise was the fact that over a third of the waste was single-use plastic. When you consider how plastic bottles alone take up to 500 years to

decompose, we know we have a problem. This waste ends up in the ground and in our beautiful Cornish rivers and oceans. An unbelievable 60 truckloads of waste are going into the planets' oceans every hour! Plastic is even now turning up in our diet due to fish eating micro-plastics! So what is the solution?

Year 4 researched alternatives and here's what we found:

- Try getting a bamboo lunchbox.
- Use reusable containers.
- Wrap your sandwiches in reusable cloths!
- Bring your water in a reusable bottle.

- Buy bigger packs of food and take only what you need each day, instead of using food individually wrapped.

Year 4 now challenges all packed lunches to reduce this number of single use plastic. This Monday 8th July, Year 4 will again be collecting our packed lunch waste before counting it and comparing the difference. Thank you for caring. Yours sincerely,
