



Why bother about Bees?

These little black and yellow stripy critters come in right at the top of survival essential list for our eco-system. Without a thriving bee population we could go very hungry. Bees pollinate 1/3 of the food we eat, and 80% of flowering plants. Livestock also rely on them to pollinate the crops grown to feed them. There are other ways to pollinate, but wild bees are a natural and efficient way of getting the job done on a big scale. Should UK farmers have to manually pollinate their crops it would cost an estimated £1.8 billion per year.

The bee population is in decline globally due to factors such as loss of habitat and toxic pesticide usage. Many of the threats to bees parallel with the threats to trees and woodland, so saving bees goes hand-in-hand with saving trees.

The big question is... where will you let your Bee Bomb explode? Is it destined for a guerrilla gardening adventure... or going home to a bare patch of garden? Sowing your Bee Bomb in March will be perfect timing and you can post your Bee Bomb's journey on the Joli Bee Facebook community group and share as your bee friendly patch grows. ## with John Hopkins




## Watercolour Mon 27th April 10am - 4pm £70

In this workshop John will show how to depict a street scene and a harbour scene, using a quick and loose watercolour technique. He will talk a little about linear and aerial perspective and how to create a good composition. Each student will receive some one-to-one tuition during the day and those who paint at a faster speed can practice new brush techniques and exercises. By the end of the workshop you will have created both a street and harbour painting.

John studied illustration at Birmingham College of Art, and has enjoyed a career as a successful freelance artist, working in all mediums, but specialising in watercolour. He prefers to work in a fast, loose, impressionistic style but always with the emphasis on good drawing skills.

John enjoys giving watercolour demonstrations to art societies and teaches painting to groups of adults. He continues to work commercially, exhibits his paintings widely and has won many awards. He undertakes private commissions including more detailed animal studies and tries to find time to include his passion for en plein-air painting and figurative work.
