Primary bone cancer can occur at any age, but affects mostly children, teenagers, young adults and the elderly. On average 12 people every week are diagnosed across the UK and Ireland. The survival rate for this disease is just over 50% and this has not changed in the last 25 years. With your help we can work towards changing this, so more people have a chance to live!

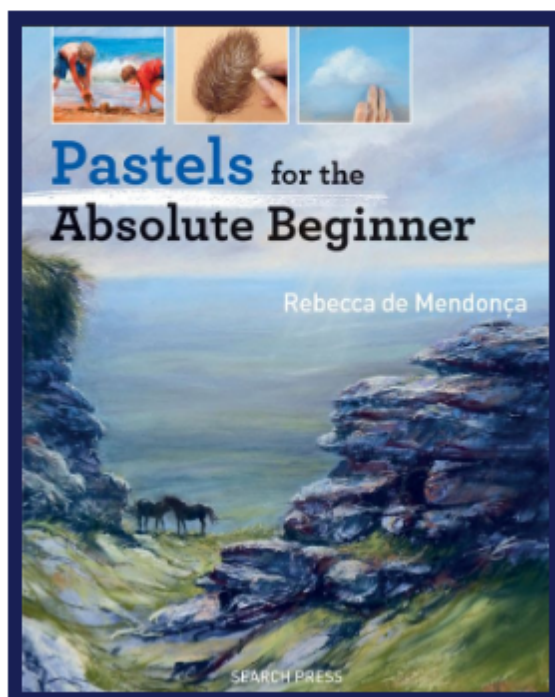


Life and Energy in Pastels

Come and have fun painting a variety of subjects with watercolour artist Kaye Parmenter, and experiment with many ways to loosen up your painting. Subjects will include flowers, animals, landscapes, skies and birds, and the workshop will begin with a demonstration of a particular subject or technique and then students all have a go. Kaye will then circulate, giving one to one advice. By the end of the day, you will have completed a few subjects and encompassed a variety of methods and techniques with loose watercolour.



Kaye is an established artist in Somerset, exhibiting in two local galleries, 303 Gallery in Martock and the Churchgate Gallery in Porlock. Her achievements include winning the Chairman's Choice award at the Bath and West Show 2009 and exhibiting in the Mall Galleries in London as part of the Art Liberating Lives Exhibition. 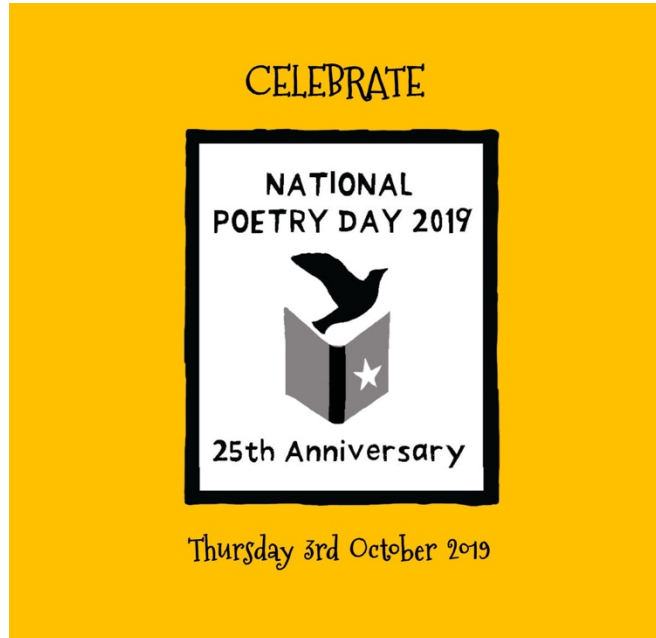
