The fireworks code

- Only buy fireworks marked BS 7114.
- · Don't drink alcohol if setting off fireworks .
- Keep fireworks in a closed box.
- Follow the instructions on each firework.
- · Light them at arm's length, using a taper.
- Stand well back.
- · Never go near a firework that has been lit. Even if it hasn't gone off, it could still explode.
- Never put fireworks in your pocket.
- Never throw fireworks.
- Always supervise children around fireworks.
- Light sparklers one at a time, and wear gloves.
- Never give sparklers to a children under 5 years of age.
- Keep pets indoors.
- Don't let off fireworks after 11pm.

Keep a bucket of water or a garden hose nearby, in case of emergencies. Don't leave the bonfire unattended. Keep children and pets away from the bonfire. Don't throw any fireworks into the fire. Don't burn aerosols, tyres, canisters, or anything containing foam or paint - many produce toxic fumes and some containers may explode, causing injury
