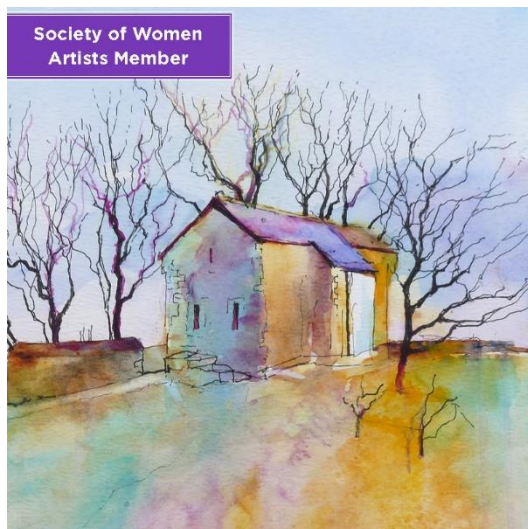


Flowing Line and Wash

Extend the expressive power of your watercolours by adding ink line to your composition to create an attractively illustrative painting. Your personable tutor Catherine will explain the benefits of this technique, looking closely at shape and considering boundaries within compositions. You will drip loose wet-in-wet colour over an under-drawing and bring it all together with strategies of reviewing



your work.



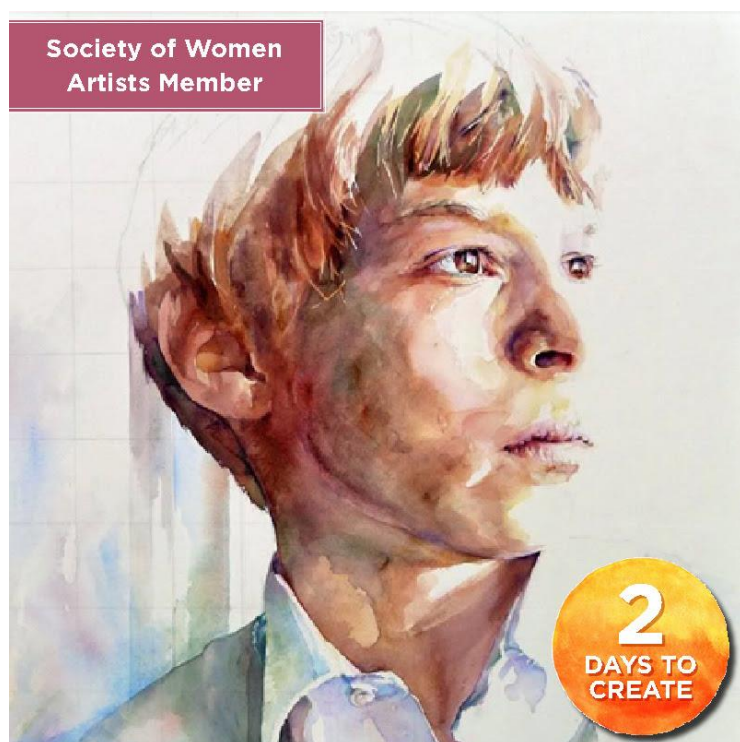
Catherine Beale is an award-winning painter from Bath where her portraits have hung in The Holburne Portrait Prize, as well as in London with the Royal Watercolour Society and Royal Institute of Painters in Watercolours. She enjoys explaining her techniques to groups, in articles in The Artist Magazine and as a registered SAA Tutor.

Catherine's paintings hang in private collections worldwide, including the Singapore Presidential Palace and have been gifted to HRH Prince Edward by the British High Commission in Singapore. She is an elected member of the hugely respected Society of Women Artists, exhibiting annually at the Society's Summer exhibition.
