Family Learning – Keeping Up with the Children in English and Maths

About this course

This is a 6-week online course for parents and carers (including grandparents, aunts, uncles etc) of primary-age children. Discussions and activities will be informal and fun with the emphasis on ways to support your child's learning and development.

Sessions will run on Fridays 13th, 20th and 27th May; 10th, 17th and 24th June from 10am until 11:30am. Enrolment will be for all 6 sessions.

Before joining this course

You will enrol as part of an Adult Education course. You can talk to one of the family learning tutors before the course: Vicki Salvidge on 07968 992495 or Chris Bevington on 07483 319945. You will need to access a laptop or other suitable device for viewing and interacting online, and we will use Microsoft Teams to run the sessions. You will not have to download this application (although you can if you want to) as an invitation can be sent to you. You will be enrolled on a Moodle portal as part of the course and there you will have access to resources and information.

What will I learn?

You will pick up ideas about supporting your child's learning and development by enjoying some chat based around simple, fun activities. Among other things, we will discuss reading with our children, helping with homework, methods in maths, how to encourage writing skills, details of grammar and punctuation – all depending on the needs of the group.

How will I learn?

Activities will be easy to access, making use of everyday objects and resources. You will be able to chat, share ideas and ask questions; follow-up information on specific ideas such as reading or numeracy skills will be available. The sessions will focus on practical tasks that adults and children can share and work together on.

Assessment methods

There is no formal assessment on this course; rather, assessment will be recorded on a simple learning journey to show how you engage and enjoy; what you have learnt about learning or about your child or yourself; and how confident you feel participating in an online group learning activity. This will be recorded electronically on our Moodle portal.

What do I need to have with me?

Sessions are online and there will be breaks so you can be flexible about refreshments etc. You will want access to pen and paper in case you want to make notes. A comfortable seat, open mind and a cup of tea might be enough!

What next?

Your tutors will talk with you as the course progresses about any other needs you have educationally, whether that be supporting your child or finding a course for yourself.

Don't worry!

We know that enrolling on any course can be daunting, but especially when it is online and you can't meet everyone in the room. The first session will be a gentle introduction with a chance to chat, find out more about the course and each other, and try out the technology. Don't forget, you can speak to the family learning tutors to find out more.
